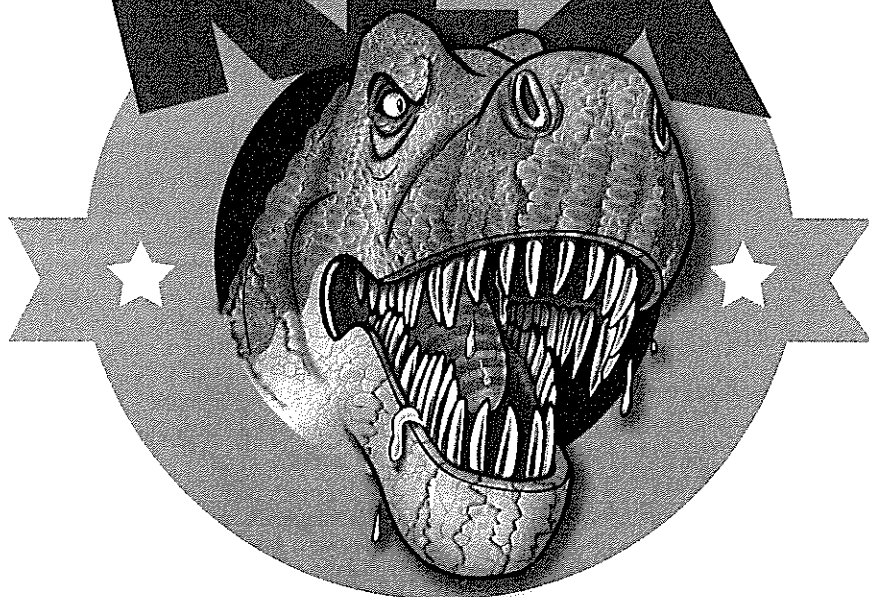

TYRANNOSAURUS REX RULES

4 Red Dinosaurs
4 Blue Dinosaurs
4 Yellow Dinosaurs
4 Green Dinosaurs
1 Black Tyrannosaurus Rex
2 White 1 – 6 spot dice
1 Black 1 – 6 spot dice

The aim

To be the first player to get all their dinosaurs from START round the board ending at HOME.

To Start

Each player chooses a colour and places each one of their four dinosaurs on their START squares and Tyrannosaurus Rex in Tyrannosaurus Rex's Den. Players roll the three dice. The highest roller starts.

To Play

On their turn a player rolls the three dice. First they move Tyrannosaurus Rex the number of spaces shown on the black dice. Tyrannosaurus Rex, on his go, can move forwards or backwards but must keep to the orange playing track.

The player then moves either two of their pieces (one for each white die) or one piece (the total white dice score) in a clockwise direction. Player's dinosaurs have to move in a clockwise direction.

Tyrannosaurus Rex

If Tyrannosaurus Rex lands on the same square as another dinosaur, that dinosaur is captured and must go to Tyrannosaurus Rex's Den. The dinosaur stays in Tyrannosaurus Rex's Den until that player on a subsequent turn rolls a six on one white die. If the player chooses he can use the six to free the dinosaur and put him on a START square.

Attacking

If a player on his turn moves his dinosaur to a space already occupied by another dinosaur, the two dinosaurs have to fight. The player owning the attacking dinosaur rolls three dice, the defender rolls two. The highest score wins. The defender wins if there is a draw. The winning dinosaur occupies the space. The loser goes to any purple space on the blue Riverbed. If none is available he must go back to START. Once a fight has taken place the attacking player's turn ends.

Purple Track on the Blue Riverbed

Tyrannosaurus Rex cannot go down the purple tracks. Any other dinosaur can use the purple track, provided he uses a six to enter the riverbed, or is sent there after losing a fight. No attacks on other dinosaurs are allowed in the Riverbed – it is a safe haven.

Winner

A player must throw the exact number to end his turn and move a dinosaur onto a HOME space. The first player to have all his dinosaurs home wins the game.

Junior Version

This game can also be played as a simple race and chase game. In this version, Tyrannosaurus Rex has to move clockwise and player's dinosaurs are not allowed to attack each other.

1. T.Rex

Nickname: Tyrant Lizard
Age: 65 million years old
Size: 12 metres (40 feet) long
Weight: 8 tons
Diet: Carnivorous, loves Hadrosaurs
Habitat: North America and Asia

2. Styracosaurus

Nickname: Spiked Lizard
Age: 70 million years old
Size: 5.2 metres (17 feet) long
Weight: 2.7 tons
Diet: Herbivore
Habitat: North America

3. Stegosaurus

Nickname: Pea Brain (due to the size of it)
Age: 150 million years old
Size: 9 metres (30 feet) long
Weight: 2 tons
Diet: Herbivore, especially fond of trees and shrubs
Habitat: North America

4. Gigantasaurus

Nickname: Banana Brain (due to the shape of it)
Age: 100 million years old
Size: 12.5 metres (42 feet) long (*Bigger than T Rex but don't tell him that!)
Weight: 8 tons
Diet: Carnivore
Habitat: South America

5. Deinonychus

Nickname: Clawfoot
Age: 110 million years old
Size: 2 metres (6.5 feet) tall
Weight: 80kg (176 pounds)
Diet: Carnivore – a fast and deadly hunter
Habitat: The American mid-west

6. Protoceratops

Nickname: Headbutter
Age: 80 million years old
Size: 1.8 metres (6 feet) long
Weight: 400 kg (500 pounds)
Diet: Herbivore
Habitat: Asia (Mongolia)

7. Oviraptor

Nickname: Egg Thief
Age: 80 million years old
Size: 1.8 metres (6 feet) long
Weight: 20 kg (44 pounds)
Diet: Omnivore
Habitat: Asia (Mongolia)

8. Ornithomimus

Nickname: Bird Mimic
Age: 70 million years old
Size: 4 metres (13 feet) long
Weight: 150kg (331 pounds)
Diet: Omnivore- likes insects, lizards, eggs, fruit and leaves
Habitat: North America

9. Diplodocus

Nickname: Dippy
Age: 150 million years old
Size: 27 metres (88 feet) long – tail bone is 14 metres (46 ft) long
Weight: 12 tons
Diet: Herbivore- that's a lot of ferns, moss and conifers
Habitat: North America

10. Brachiosaurus

Nickname: Giraffe
Age: 150 million Years old
Size: 30 metres (100 feet) long
Weight: 30-50 tons
Diet: Herbivore - fruit and leaves are favourites
Habitat: North America Africa

11. Riojasaurus

Nickname: Vino Dino
 Age: 220 million Years old
 Size: 10 metres (33 feet) long
 Weight: 1 ton
 Diet: Herbivore- ferns, trees, horsetail leaves, Gingko leaves
 Habitat: South America (Argentina)

12. Wannonasaurus

Nickname: Wannabe Bigger
 Age: 85 million years old
 Size: 60 centimetres (24 inches long)
 Diet: Herbivore- low growing plants
 Habitat: Asia

13. Velociraptor

Nickname: Plunderer
 Age: 80 million years old
 Size: 1.8 metres (6 feet) long
 Weight: 25 kg (55 pounds)
 Diet: Carnivore. Loves dining on Protoceratops
 Habitat: Asia- Mongolia and China

14. Iguanodon

Nickname: Iggy
 Age: 130 million years old
 Size: 10 metres (33 feet long)
 Weight: 5 tons
 Diet: Herbivore
 Habitat: North America, UK, Belgium and Germany (this guy gets around)

15. Minmi

Nickname: Bumpy
 Age: 115 million years old
 Size: 3 metres (10 feet) long
 Weight: 1 ton
 Diet: Herbivore- low growing vegetation
 Habitat: Australia

16. Megalosaurus

Nickname: Garbage Guts
 Age: 170 million years old
 Size: 9 metres (30 feet long)
 Weight: 1 ton
 Diet: Carnivore and Scavenger.
 Habitat: UK

17. Parasaurolophus

Nickname: Trumpeter
 Age: 75 million years old
 Size: 10 metres (33 feet) long
 Weight: 3.5 tons
 Diet: Herbivore
 Habitat: North America
